Pictorial Essay Title:	
 Is concise, reflects the findings of the case and attracts the reader. 	
Includes that it is a pictorial Essay	
Abstract: (50-150 words)	
 Concise summary of the pictorial essay that is unstructured. 	
 Contain sufficient information of the content of the article to be a 	
standalone entity.	
References are not necessary
