Illustrations may be sent via e-mail as a TIFF or JPEG file.

images. DO NOT embed the images in the text/word document. Use the maximum resolution	
on your PACS system (usually 640-480).	
Use the maximum resolution of the camera (3.2 megapixel minimum).	
Do not crop the images as you lose resolution; instead, zoom in to get the maximum image in	
the frame for the photograph.	
Illustrations	
Patient identification MUST BE removed as should all hospital identification and dates on the	
images.	
Should clarify and complement the text.	
Each illustration should be clearly labeled with the figure number, title i.e. Figure 1 Title, Figure	
2-Title, etc. and cited in numerical order in the text document for correct position of	
figure/table placement.	
Labels or arrows may be used to point out areas of interest and should be detailed in the	
legend.	
Note: Figure reproduction cannot improve on the quality of the originals
